

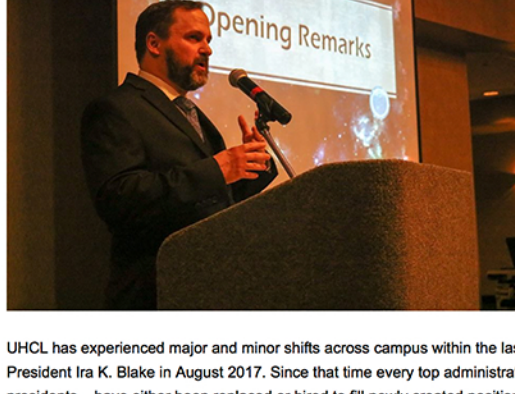

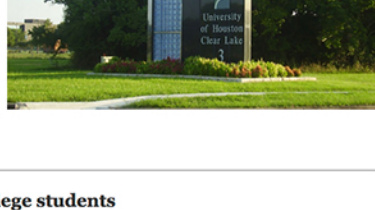
Common Reader Program to host final events for 2018-2019 book selection

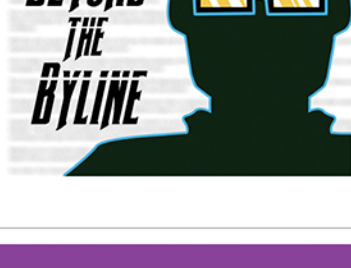
