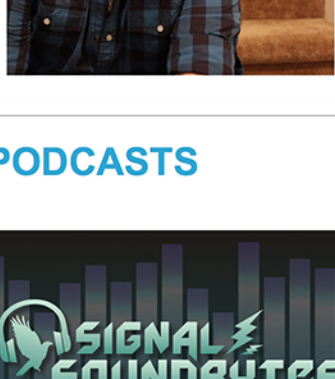
REVIEW: Janelle Monáe captivates cyberspace and reality by uploading an emotion picture
